



This option costs \$0.78 per kilowatt hour more than Basic Service, which equals about 10 percent extra on your monthly bill. Plus, OIPL receives a \$20 contribution (from Blue Sky) for each enrollment in Blue Sky Usage.

Blue Sky Habitat option: This option works just like Blue Sky Usage, except you also pay an additional \$2.50 per month that goes to The Nature Conservancy for local salmon habitat restoration, which is tax deductible.
